Provider Impressions

Primary and Secondary Impressions should be used to indicate your clinical impression for the patient.

▶ **Your interventions should reflect your clinical impressions.**

▶ If you indicate an impression of a stroke or STEMI, your treatments and scene time should follow that clinical path

▶ Many times the secondary impression is used to list off things that "could" be wrong with the patient, similar to a differential

▶ Using it as a differential is incorrect and may make it appear you believe the patient was critically ill but recieved minimal care
